



## MSD Warren Township School Report Card Creston Intermediate Academy

The Metropolitan School District of Warren Township is committed to "**continuous improvement**".

Our **Board of Education Goals for 2013-14** are focused on "**INCREASED STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**".

1. **Achievement**-Each school in the Metropolitan School District of Warren Township will continue the goal of achieving the highest rating in the Indiana Department of Education's A-F accountability guidelines. Each school will have a continued focus on identifying achievement gaps among student populations and responding appropriately to close those gaps. Schools will utilize a continuous improvement process as the foundation for building academic success. The emphasis will be on critical thinking, depth of knowledge, and those skills associated with transitioning to Indiana's Common Core Standards. ISTEP, IREAD3, Acuity, and district-wide assessments will be among the data points collected to measure success in meeting performance goals for elementary, intermediate, and middle school accountability. The high school accountability will be determined by concentrating on End of Course Assessments, credit attainment, dual credit attainment, and graduation rate. The Board will continue to welcome accountability measures from state and federal legislatures for improving student and school performance.

2. **Technology**-The Metropolitan School District of Warren Township will continue its focus on effective delivery of virtual instruction using blended learning, online courses, and distance education. The district will also continue to focus on enhancing its learning environments through technology integration. This will be accomplished by extending its anywhere, anytime access to information; as well as the fusion of technology into the instructional atmosphere to enhance 21st-Century learning.

3. **Parent Engagement and Advocacy**-The Metropolitan School District of Warren Township will actively seek and embrace parental engagement and advocacy in all phases of educational development, including character education. Parent engagement between educators and students is a collaborative approach to share common goals toward academic achievement that should be enhanced through web based communication.

4. **Maintain Financial Stability**-During these difficult economic times, the Board of Education will continue to monitor efficiencies, balance budgets, and react to state and federal funding shifts. This may be accomplished through, but not limited to the following: looking at state and federal grant opportunities, federal stimulus dollars, endowments and private grant opportunities.

5. **Community Outreach**-The Board of Education will increase outreach within the Warren Township community. We will welcome new business partnerships, recognize established businesses, and foster and collaborate with existing businesses and grassroots organizations. In addition, the board will support and encourage student and staff community service, promote wellness, physical fitness, and healthy lifestyle choices.

**1. Strategy: Increase the Staff and Student Attendance Rate**

Benchmark:

- a. Annual Staff Attendance (97% = District Mark)
- b. Annual Student Attendance (96% = District Mark)

**2. Strategy: Raise Standardized Test Scores**

Benchmark:

- a. Grade Five ISTEP+
  - 85% of students passing Math, or an increase of 5% over previous year
  - 85% of students passing Language Arts, or an increase of 5% over previous year
  - 70% of students passing BOTH, or an increase of 5% over previous year
  - 70% of students passing Social Studies, or an increase of 5% over previous year

  - 70% of students passing Science, or an increase of 5% over previous year

  - At least 42.5% E/LA of the lowest performing students on ISTEP+ (the bottom 25%) show high growth in English/Language Arts.
  - At least 44.9% of the lowest performing students on ISTEP+ (the bottom 25%) show high growth in Math.
  - At least 36.2% E/LA of their remaining students on ISTEP+ (the top 75%) show high growth in English/Language Arts.
  - At least 39.2% of their remaining students on ISTEP+ (the top 75%) show high growth in Math.
