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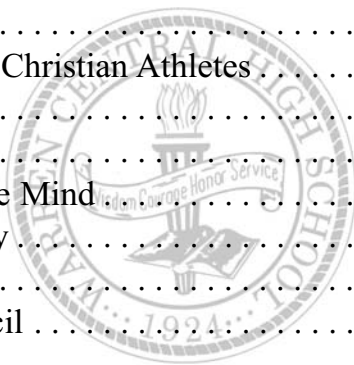
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MISSION STATEMENT

INTRODUCTION TO LEADERSHIP CODE

Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center is a first-class commissioned high school representing the highest expectations for its programs, faculty, and student body. In keeping with this tradition of excellence, the individual seeking to hold a position of leadership must be willing to maintain similar high standards in all phases of his/her academic and personal life. As a Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center leader, an individual will be accountable to the public as well as the school community.

It should be remembered that participation as an officer in Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center organizations is a privilege and not a right. Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center expects a higher standard of conduct from its leaders; therefore, in order to encourage and maintain the most responsible kinds of leadership in the many organizations available to the students of Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center, the following standards have been adopted. Students wishing to follow this higher standard of conduct are encouraged to pursue a position of leadership in a school activity.

These standards shall apply to any student in a leadership position in any approved Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center Co-curricular organization or club.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

ACADEMIC STANDARDS

A school leader:

1. Must have a class schedule with no less than 5 solids (*5 full credit classes*).
 - a. Failure to meet the above requirement will result in the suspension of an officer for that semester. If the situation is corrected at the beginning of the next semester, the student will resume his/her office. If the situation occurs a second time, the student will be removed for the remainder of the year.
 - b. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.
2. Must be passing in all five solids at the end of each nine week grading period.
 - a. Failure to meet the above requirement will result in the suspension of an officer for a period of nine weeks. At the end of that ninth week, the student will be reinstated to the office if the academic standard has been fulfilled. If the student fails to remedy the situation at the end of the nine weeks, or if the problem occurs a second time during the year, he/she will be removed from the office for the remainder of that school year.
 - b. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.

3. Must have at the time of application and maintain through the term in office, a grade average of not less than a C.
 - a. Failure to meet the above requirement will make a student ineligible to hold office for the next immediate school semester.
 - b. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.
4. It is recommended that each sponsor check his/her officers' grades at the end of each nine weeks. Additionally, an administrator will supervise and enforce the overall academic standard.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

PERSONAL STANDARDS

A school leader;

1. Must not use or possess illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco at any time.
 - a. Failure to meet the above requirement will result in the removal of an officer for the remaining school year. Failure to follow this requirement a second time will permanently disqualify the student from holding any office during his/her high school career.
 - b. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.
2. Must reflect acceptable personal conduct both in school and out.
 - a. Must not violate any school rule which would result in assignment to the Reassignment Room or suspension from school; i.e. lateness, cheating, fighting, profanity, vandalism, theft, truancy, etc.
 - b. Failure to meet the above requirement will result in the student being reprimanded by the sponsor. Failure to meet this requirement a second time will result in the student being removed from the office for the remaining school year.
 - c. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.

3. Must not violate any law out of school which would result in a legal conviction; i.e., misdemeanors, felonies.
 - a. Failure to meet the above requirement will result in the removal of an officer for the remaining school year. Failure to follow this requirement a second time will permanently disqualify the student from holding any office during his/her high school career.
 - b. The procedure to replace an officer shall be left up to the individual organization.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

LEADERSHIP PARTICIPATION STANDARDS

1. Any further specific requirement or restriction concerning a particular office in any Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center organization shall be left to the discretion of the individual organization.
2. It is strongly recommended that these requirements be clearly stated in writing in the constitution and be made readily available to the students in that organization.

STUDENT/PARENT CONTRACT

Participation in a school organization is a rewarding experience for a student. Parents should be proud to be involved with the school.

The sponsor of each individual organization will provide each student a copy of the Student/Parent Contract. This is a contract between the school, the student involved in the organization, and the parent of the student leader. This contract should be read and carefully discussed between the child and the parent. If any questions result from the contract, the parent(s) is entitled to contact the principal to answer any questions.

This contract will be strictly enforced by the administration of Warren Central High School/Walker Career Center and any violation will result in the stated remedy. Actions taken in regard to any violation cannot be appealed; once a violation has been found and the removal imposed, there is no further action available to the student or parent. All officers of all organizations are subject to the rules of the leadership code. All rules and violations will be imposed equally on the officers.

We have read, discussed and understand the leadership code, the punishment for violations, and this contract. We agree to abide by the terms of this contract throughout the term of office.
